

Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (SAVE ACT)

The Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act, or Campus SAVE Act, is a 2013 amendment to the federal Jeanne Clery Act. Southeastern Community College reaffirms the principle that students and employees have a right to be free from any form of sexual offense, both forcible and non-forcible. Sexual offenses are unlawful and prohibited. The college provides programs to promote the awareness and prevention of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking throughout the year.
